## Dr. Ed Thomas Selected to Lead Iowa Health and Physical Education Teachers

Des Moines, IA, November 25, 2009 – Iowa native and physical training expert Dr. Ed Thomas was recently named the 2009-2010 President of The Iowa Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance. He is currently the Iowa Department of Education Health and Physical Education Consultant and an Associate Professor of Health and Movement Science at Graceland University.

Thomas has taught exercise science and human movement for over thirty years at numerous schools including The University of Iowa, Emory University, Northern Illinois University, and Upper Iowa University-Fort Benning.
